 - Increase services to senior centers and homebound patrons
 - Draft formal agreement with the Friends of the Romeo District Library
- Bring RDL’s outreach to the next level
 - Consider bookmobile
 - Consider automated book vending machine in underserved area

3. Increase quality of RDL collection of materials

- Meet level of demand for new materials
 - Increase variety and volume of new releases
- Enhance existing collection
 - Explore the possibility of unique non-traditional collections for circulation
- Expand Community Archives
 - Explore acquiring new local history collections

- Improve Children's Services Room
 - Enhance space with improved color and design
 - Provide inclusive / interactive spaces
 - Replace carpeting
 - Reconfigure Children's services reference desk
- Improve Adult Services Room
 - Reconfigure space to improve way-finding
 - Consider the layout to resemble a bookstore for a more user-friendly experience
 - Replace carpeting
 - Explore possibilities of self-service areas
 - Café / lounge
 - Self-service office (copy / fax)
 - Remote self-check stations
- Improve Teen Space
 - Explore possibilities of walling off area, creating a defined space
 - Enhance space with improved color and design, appealing to the target demographic
- Increase public use of ground space
 - Explore possibilities of a park or playground
 - Explore the possibilities of a walk-through garden / family picnic area
 - Explore the potential of connecting to the Macomb Orchard Trail
 - Explore the potential of an amphitheater
 - Draft formal agreement for volunteer Graubner grounds keeping projects
