In the last fiscal year:

- We have had 19,089 users through our doors
- · We have checked out 197,305 items
- 7,621 people have attended programs
- Our internet has been used for 12,738 hours with WiFi usage increasing by 11%
- Our spending on library programs and collections has increased by 15%
- We have had 720 hours of volunteer time at the Community Archives
- We have accepted 24% more materials through interlibrary loan
- 35,021 items have been downloaded from our digital services, including ebooks, music, audiobooks

Also, in the last year, the children's, adult, and teen areas at our Grauber Branch have all been renovated. We hope you come and see all the improvements.




