












It's coming!

AN UPDATE FROM OUR FRIENDS



As challenges continue from COVID-19, we are happy to reflect on the many positive ways our community has benefitted in recent months:

- In 2020, the Friends donated \$25,000 towards the purchase of a **bookmobile** van. The van was used during COVID closure to deliver books to patrons, and now is bringing requested materials directly to RCS schools. **See our van in the Romeo Santa Parade December 2!** A **scanner** for the Romeo Community Archives was also purchased.
- Our **annual rummage sale** was held (outdoors!) in May 2021 with the addition of several beautiful plants from local gardens.
- Two new Friends **tote bag designs** were introduced in 2021 by Romeo High School artists Michael Gleason and Jenna Knepper, and sell for only \$12.00 each.
- A \$2,000 anonymous donation was received to support scholarships. Scholarships are awarded each spring: one or more to qualifying high school senior(s), and up to \$1,500 to support a candidate working on an MLIS (Masters in Library and Information Science) degree (see RDL.org/friends/scholarships).
- The Graubner store wrapped up a successful monthlong bag sale in mid-October, as Kezar did with a \$1 bag sale in November. We still have lots of holiday books at a steal—nothing over \$3.00! EVERYTHING at Kezar is half price on Saturdays. This is **one-stop shopping** for all the bookworms on your gift list!
- We are proud to support the 2022 Battle of the Books for the 5th and 7th grades.
- Besides our core mission of supporting library programs, the Friends make books and media available to senior centers, nursing and assisted living homes, teachers and schools. Over 3,500 books and media have been donated since March 2020 to Operation Paperback, in support of our military, both active troops and veterans.
