
### No Man's Land: Surviving the Holocaust and Soviet Gulags

### Thursday, September 29, 7:00-8:00 pm

Irene Miller had to flee with her family from Warsaw into the Soviet Union to escape the Holocaust. She found herself cold, hungry, separated, and eventually, in a Siberian labor camp. Hear this amazing woman's struggle to own her right to live - a story told directly from one of the quiet warriors who are becoming fewer every day.

### Life at Michilimackinac Thursday, October 6, 7:00-8:00 pm

Local historian Richard Beringer will share what living at Fort Michilimackinac in the 1700s was like. Learn what really happened in Chief Pontiac's Rebellion and the resulting massacre of the British garrison on June 2, 1763. The French encouraged the Ojibwa tribe to rid the area of British troops and influence. Today we associate the area with fudge, t-shirts and carriage rides; this program will prove there's a whole lot more to this historical area.






