AN UPDATE FROM OUR FRIENDS

The 2022 Friends financial statement brings good news: revenue for the year (\$15,431) exceeded the budget by almost 50%. In fact, revenue in all categories—book store sales, rummage and used computer sales, memberships, eBay sales, and t-shirt and tote bag sales—leaves us with almost **\$22,000 in uncommitted funds** to spend on library programs.

THANK YOU to all of our donors and customers who made this possible.

In January, the Friends voted to commit \$2,500 in matching funds to the Four-County's **Imagination Library Fund (https://www.4ccf.org/initiatives/four-county-imagination-library/**). The Friends will match individual donations up to a limit of \$2,500. Watch for publicity regarding this match program starting in March.
