

Why would anyone want a library card? For so many reasons!

- Reserve popular materials from libraries countywide or even statewide, or get on a popular waiting list.
- <u>Download items</u> like eBooks, movies, TV shows, audiobooks & magazines.
- Use any other library in Macomb County.
- Research genealogy with Ancestry or Fold3 through our website.
- <u>Log in to Consumer Reports or New York Times</u> online without paying for a subscription.
- <u>Register for programs</u> like summer reading and those with limited spots.
- <u>Pick up requested materials 24/7</u> from the outdoor lockers at either of our branches.
- <u>Get free or discounted passes</u> to state parks, metroparks, museums and other attractions with Michigan Activity Pass on our website.

- Watch live author talks online and ask them your questions. Upcoming authors include Ruth Ware and John Irving.
- <u>Log in to tutor.com</u> through our website for one-on-one instruction with a vetted tutor for any grade level at no cost to you—even to proofread papers.
- <u>Save at local businesses</u> like Brown Iron Brewhouse & Achatz Pies (see others from The Go Library Card under the 'Services' tab on our website).

And here's a tip: download our library group **mobile app** (search SLC Libraries), then load your library card number on your phone. It will display your barcode, and that is readable with our checkout scanners. No need to even carry your card! The app is also a great way to search for materials and manage your holds list.

Apply for an RDL library card in person at either one of our branches or on **www.rdl.org** and have the card sent to you. Share the news with neighbors, and I hope to see you at the library soon!

Medicare 101


