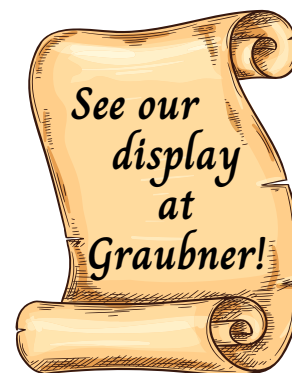


April is National Poetry Month

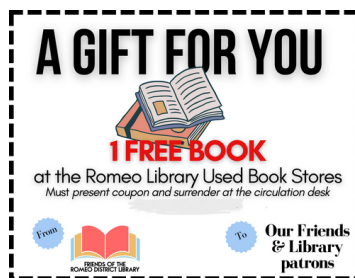
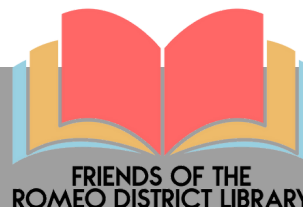

- RDL employees who are completing their bachelor's degree with the intent to further study in Library and Information Sciences. At least one award of \$500 is available.
