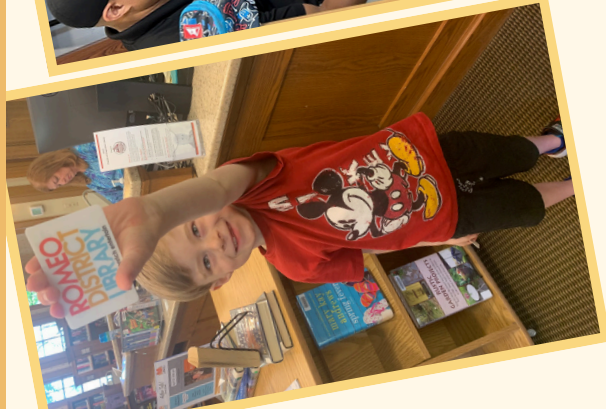

We're always looking for ways to provide you with the best service possible. To make life a *little* easier, we now have:

faxing and printing: We know there are still places that will only accept paperwork via fax, and now we can help you with that—free of charge. The new system at our Graubner Branch is based on a scanner that will also allow you to scan to your phone, e-mail or Google drive. Printing costs remain, but I'll bet there are a lot of you like me, who only occasionally have to print something and can't justify paying for a printer at home. If that is the case, come to the library and we'll help you print at a small cost.

notary: You can also have documents **notarized** here at no cost. Certified employees at both branches are happy to help. Please call first to make sure they are available.

free or discounted passes: Our continuing partnership with MAP (Michigan Activity Pass) supplies mobile passes to attractions and parks throughout the state, including free day passes to Stony Creek Metropark. Find this service at www.rdl.org or www.miactivitypass.org.
