I feel very strongly about children learning to love reading because of the time their grown-ups spend sharing books with them.

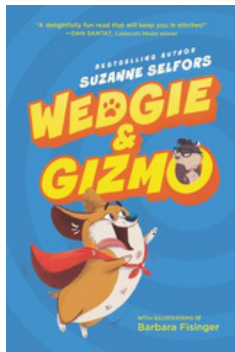

AN UPDATE FROM OUR FRIENDS



Spring is “**Scholarship Season**” for the Friends. Since 2002, we have provided more than \$24,000 in educational support in scholarships to Romeo-area residents or employees of Romeo District Library who are working toward a master’s degree in Library and Information Sciences. Awards range from \$500 to \$2,000. Scholarships awarded in 2025 may be applied to Fall 2025, Winter 2026 and/or Spring 2026 terms.

At least one award of \$500 is available to employees of Romeo District Library who are completing their bachelor’s degree with the intention of further study in Library and Information Sciences.
