The BIG news at RDL is... our Graubner Branch on Van Dyke is going to be expanded and renovated!

After a year of data collecting and analysis through a needs assessment, our board of trustees made the decision to make improvements to our main branch. We have completed the planning stages and hired a construction company, and plan to break ground in April 2026! Construction and renovation should be complete within a year. Here's what you will see improved and included in the 5,000-square-foot addition:

- Expanded children's department & New youth room for programs
- New teen department with a group study room and a gaming station
- Expanded community meeting room with improved audio/visual
- Enclosed courtyard/Big Brother Bear Discovery Zone with gated fence
- New and improved study rooms
- New Friends of the Library used bookstore
- · Resurfaced parking lot

The great news is that we are financing half the cost (to be paid back in eight years) and paying the other half from our fund balance. This means there is <u>no additional cost to our residents!</u>

We will share lots of information with you as we go, including renderings so you can get a good look at what we're working on.
