At RDL, we are constantly evolving and looking for ways to improve our services, facilities, and offerings. We are also very aware that the comfort of knowing that the library will always have great books and friendly, helpful staff is important to our community. We value the trust you have in us.

The next year brings a lot of change for us, and I am humbly asking for your patience and grace. We will be starting the renovation and expansion of our Graubner Branch soon. Here's what that means for you.

- Some materials will be moving or temporarily have limited access
- The drive-up drop box will be temporarily relocated to the front of the building
- Graubner will be closed to the public on occasional days in the interest of safety
- There may not be as much quiet with the construction going on
- The Community Meeting Room will be unavailable during construction, so there will be library programs elsewhere in the community as we collaborate with other organizations
- The play area, Big Brother Bear Discovery Zone, will be temporarily stored, and later reinstalled inside a safer, fenced area for families to enjoy

Here's what will not change:

- We'll continue to add new titles to our collections
- Our Kezar Branch will be open and ready to serve you as always
- Our staff will be ready to help any way they can
- We will still be out and about in the community
- You can still request materials from other libraries and pick them up from us

The project begins April 20, 2026, and is expected to take approximately one year to complete. Many of our subcontractors are from our community or Macomb County, and our construction site supervisor is a Romeo High School graduate, so we're keeping things local. This entire project is being paid for with savings and a small bond issue, and at no cost to you as a resident. The project will not have an effect on your property taxes at all!

Tom Stanton's *The Final Season* offers a powerful memoir of fathers, sons, and the end of a baseball era.


